1 **6.08 - EARLY COLLEGE ADMISSION**

3 In keeping with the State Board of Education’s endorsement of the Early Admission Program,¹
4 a high school student may complete college coursework while attending high school and
5 earning high school credit.

7 To be considered for this program, the student shall:

- 8
9 1. Earn a cumulative grade point average of at least 3.5 through three (3) years of high
10 school;
- 11
12 2. Earn an ACT composite of at least 25;
- 13
14 3. Submit a written request to the high school principal at the end of the eleventh (11th)
15 year of school, signed by student and parent(s)/guardian(s);
- 16
17 4. With parent(s)/guardian(s), meet with principal and counselor for consultation;
- 18
19 5. Submit a letter stating educational and vocational goals, his/her plans for attaining
20 them, and ways in which early admission will assist in reaching these goals;
- 21
22 6. Secure the recommendation to the program by the principal, counselor and two (2)
23 classroom teachers;
- 24
25 7. Be accepted into an early admission program by an accredited institution of higher
26 learning; and

28 Not be required to participate in the graduation program.
